Finance Committee

The Finance Committee provides financial oversight to build and preserve resources necessary for church missions and ministries, both short-term and long-term. The team manages the process to develop the annual operating budget, then reports and monitors adherence to budget on a monthly basis. They support and guide the Business Administrator and the church on financial and accounting process and create policies to protect organizational assets.

The Endowment Team oversees and manages our long-term endowment. They establish investment policies to guide portfolio management. They work to encourage membership to participate in long-term support of our congregation through investment in our endowment.

Property & Grounds Committee

The Property & Grounds Committee inspects and oversees the condition of the building and grounds through repair and preventive maintenance activities. They negotiate contracts for administrative and maintenance services. This team directs and manages a multi-decade capital plan and the related improvement projects, including specifications, contractors, bidding, contracts and oversight. They collaborate with our Facilities Manager on project plans/execution and supervision of our Sexton.

The Garden Ministry is aligned with the Property & Grounds Committee.

Service & Justice Committee

The Service & Justice Committee oversees our funding and activities related to a wide range of ministries that deliver services and integrate with external organizations seeking to deliver service and justice in our community and world. Nursery

Infants and Toddlers (Sundays, during worship, year-round)

Church School Classes (Program Year: late August through May)

Sunday Preschool (ages 3 & 4)

Preschool is in a loving, nurturing environment. Teachers are there to meet the parents, welcome each youngster and to help them feel secure in a new setting as a part of a faith community. Children learn the stories of our faith tradition followed by an activity and fellowship. Young Children & Worship (K—2nd Grade)

This worship and learning model provides the opportunity for children to *experience* God at the same time as *learning* about God through a sensory-motor style of Biblical storytelling. By providing the freedom and sacred time to respond to God via a variety of ways, children worship meaningfully together and are prepared to worship with the congregation and to tell the stories of God to others. Children begin worship with parents then meet leaders at the back of Sanctuary to go to class. *For more information, contact Catherine Curtis, Director of Christian Education* (catherine@fccge.org, or 630-469-3096 x23).

"Lighting the Way" (3rd—5th Grade)

This program utilizes the workshop Rotation Model and emphasizes interactive and experiential learning. Children experience the same Bible story during a multiweek unit by visiting a different workshop each Sunday. The workshops include: Art, Drama & Puppets, Games, Computers, Film, Bible Exploration, and Cooking. Children begin worship with parents then meet leaders at the back of Sanctuary to go to class. Confirmation Years I & II (6th & 7th Grade)

The 6th and 7th graders are a part of our Confirmation process as the first and second years of a three-year program. The youth in this class will dig deeper into the Bible by discovering who wrote the Bible, understanding the time line of when it was written, and why different books were included or excluded. Confirmation Year III (8th Grade)

In the third and final year of the three-year Confirmation program, our 8th graders will prepare for church membership by exploring the Christian story, learning about the United Church of Christ, and discerning what it means to follow Jesus. Each Confirmand is required to select a sponsor who will help them through the nine-month process. The Confirmation program requires a high commitment from class members, their families and their sponsor. Confirmands will also have several opportunities for relationship-building. Our Whole Lives offers children and youth a profound opportunity to deepen their faith and put their values into practice. The curriculum promotes sexual and emotional health in our communities and fosters meaningful dialogue between peers, partners, families, and friends.

Our Whole Lives is comprehensive sexuality education, which is about much more than just anatomy and health. It's about values, respect, emotions and justice too. It's about the sacred aspects of sexuality, which is part of the miracle of creation. This is why we teach Our Whole Lives in church—because sexuality is sacred, and sexuality education is ministry. We currently offer programming for Junior High youth and Senior High youth. Both are two-year programs that include one retreat each of the two years. Faith & Life Center

Located on the main floor off of the Lobby, the Faith & Life Center is open on Sunday mornings and weekdays during regular office hours.

It contains a wide selection of books for adults on subjects such as personal and family life, social issues, church leadership, devotional life, Bible studies, fiction and biographies. Many of these titles are not found within the public library system, although we do include bestsellers of spiritual and social justice nature. The children and youth sections contain a wide selection of books that address spiritual and moral formation with an emphasis on loving relationships and empathy towards others.

Special books are available that parents may check-out to read along with their children about difficult to discuss topics such as death and dying, divorce, drug and child abuse, aging and sexuality.
